All Saints has intersected with our Diocese of Virginia a lot lately. From hosting the ordinations of seven priests on January 6 (and I continue to be thankful for so many volunteers who made that celebration possible), to Bishop Stephenson speaking to our Men's Group last Monday (he was AWESOME), we often collaborate with and welcome many of our Episcopal brothers and sisters. In fact, we sometimes interact with our diocese in ways we don't realize: hosting meetings, other Episcopalians enrolling their children in the Preschool or attending a concert, to Roslyn Conference Center being our neighbor.
